



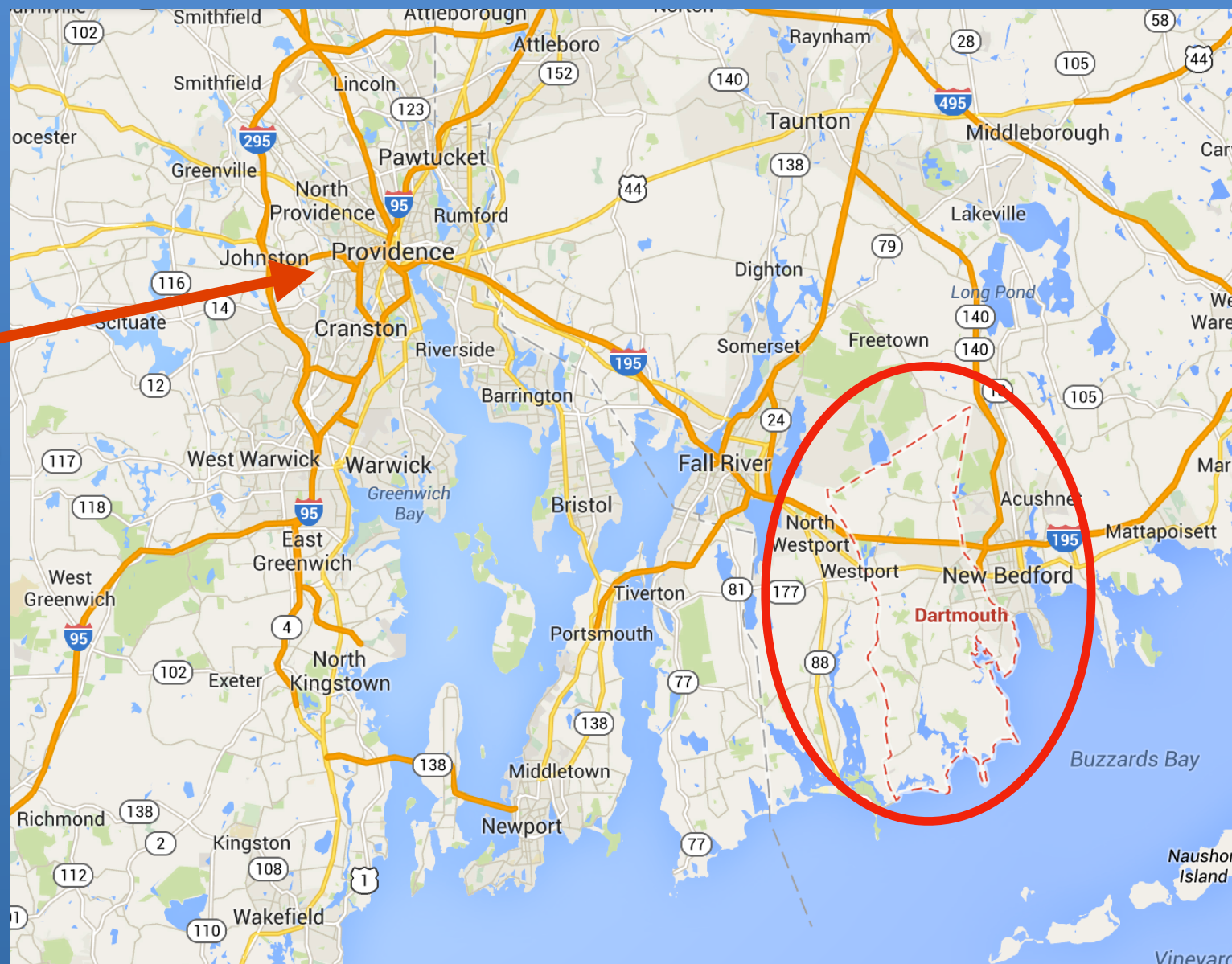

What's a Plugin?

A WordPress Plugin is a program, or a set of one or more functions that adds a specific set of features, or alters the default behavior of a WordPress site.

Plugins reside in the wp-content/plugins folder



How Do They Work?

- Action Hooks
- Filter Hooks
- WordPress APIs



Actions

Actions are hooks that allow you to execute some code that does something.

WordPress has a ton of these built in for you to use, but you can also create your own.

Filters

Filters are hooks that allow you to **CHANGE** something.

WordPress also has a ton of these built in for you to use, but you can also create your own.

Important Rules

- Namespacing: Use a unique prefix to all of your plugin's functions
 - Avoids conflicts with WordPress core functions
 - Avoids conflicts with other plugins

Namespacing

Bad Naming Conventions

```
function hello_world() {  
    //function contents  
}  
  
function init() {  
    //Function contents  
}
```

Namespacing

Good Naming Conventions

```
function wcpvd_hello_world() {  
    //function contents  
}  
  
function wcpvd_init() {  
    //Function contents  
}
```


WP_Debug Mode

- Turn on WP_Debug mode in your wp-config.php file.
- Will display errors to you on the screen for easier debugging.
- Help you write better code.
- NEVER enable this on production.

```
*/  
define('WP_DEBUG', true);
```

Never...

- Develop a new plugin on a production site.

Creating Your Plugin

First part of every plugin is the File Header. This helps WordPress recognize the file as a plugin, and describes itself to admins so they know what they are activating.

```
<?php
/*
Plugin Name: Jon's Plugin
Plugin URI: http://jonathandesrosiers.com
Description: Jon's plugin created for WordCamp Providence 2014
Version: 1.0
Author: desrosj
Author URI: http://jonathandesrosiers.com
License: GPLv2 or later
*/
```


Adding to an Action Hook

```
function wcpvd_function_name() {  
    //Function Code  
}  
add_action( 'action_name', 'wcpvd_function_name' );
```

Create A Custom Post Type

WordPress comes with some core post types (posts, pages, attachments), but sometimes we have other content that should be separate.

Examples:

- Movies
- Locations
- Products
- Cars

Create A Custom Post Type

- Should be done within the 'init' action (initialization) hook.

```
function wcpvd_init() {  
    //Function Code  
}  
add_action( 'init', 'wcpvd_init' );
```

Create A Custom Post Type

- Use the `register_post_type()` function

```
function wcpvd_init() {  
    register_post_type( $post_type, $args );  
}  
add_action( 'init', 'wcpvd_init' );
```

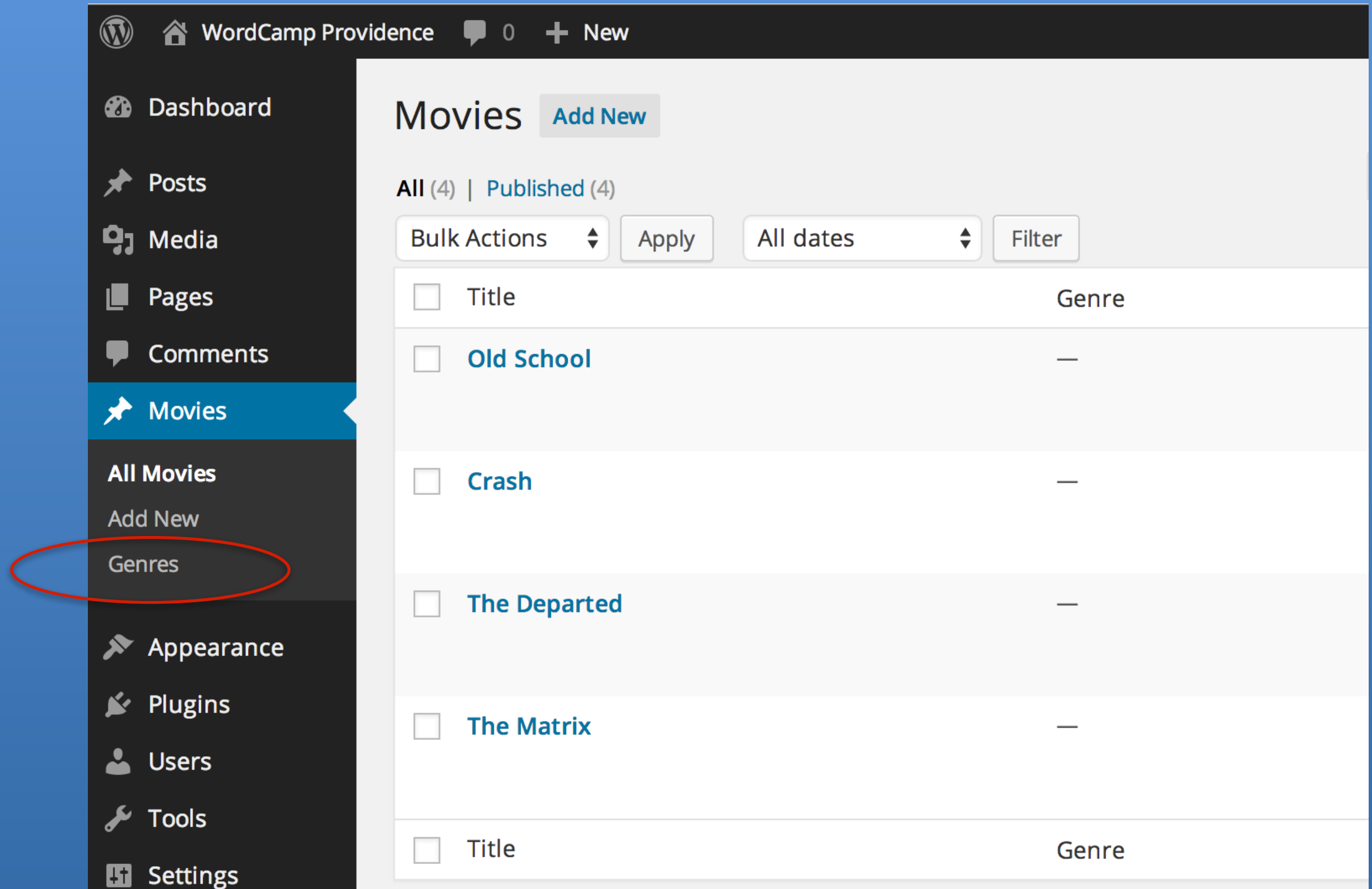

Create A Custom Taxonomy

- Use `register_taxonomy()` function.

```
function wcpvd_init() {  
    ...  
    $taxonomy_args = array(  
        'labels' => array(  
            'name' => 'Genre',  
            'singular_name' => 'Genre',  
            'search_items' => 'Search Genres',  
            'all_items' => 'All Genres',  
            'parent_item' => 'Parent Genre',  
            'parent_item_colon' => 'Parent Genre:',  
            'edit_item' => 'Edit Genre',  
            'update_item' => 'Update Genre',  
            'add_new_item' => 'Add New Genre',  
            'new_item_name' => 'New Genre Name',  
            'menu_name' => 'Genres',  
        ),  
        'hierarchical' => true,  
        'show_ui' => true,  
        'query_var' => true,  
        'rewrite' => array( 'slug' => 'genres' ),

Add CSS Class to Movie CPT

- `post_class()` function outputs classes for a post.
- Add to it with the 'post_class' filter.

```
function wcpvd_post_class( $classes, $class, $post_id ) {  
    //Filter code  
}  
add_filter( 'post_class', 'wcpvd_post_class', 10, 3 );
```


Add CSS Class to Movie CPT

```
function wcpvd_post_class( $classes, $class, $post_id ) {  
    if ( 'wcpvd_movie' != get_post_type( $post_id ) )  
        return $classes;  
  
    $genres = get_the_terms( $post_id, 'wcpvd_genre' );  
  
    if ( empty( $genres ) || is_wp_error( $genres ) )  
        return $classes;  
  
    foreach ( $genres as $genre )  
        $classes[] = 'genre-' . $genre->slug;  
  
    return $classes;  
}  
add_filter( 'post_class', 'wcpvd_post_class', 10, 3 );
```

Add CSS Class to Movie CPT

```

Custom Post Meta

- Metadata is data that describes other data
- Use the WordPress Metadata API

Custom Post Meta - Step 1

- Register our post meta box

```
function wcpvd_movie_add_meta_boxes() {  
    add_meta_box( $id, $title, $callback_function, $post_type, $context, $priority );  
}  
add_action( 'add_meta_boxes', 'wcpvd_movie_add_meta_boxes' );
```

Custom Post Meta - Step 1

- Register our post meta box

```
function wcpvd_movie_add_meta_boxes() {  
    add_meta_box( 'wcpvd_movie_info', 'Movie Info', 'wcpvd_movie_info_meta_box',  
        'wcpvd_movie', 'side', 'high' );  
}  
add_action( 'add_meta_boxes', 'wcpvd_movie_add_meta_boxes' );
```

Custom Post Meta - Step 2

- Display our post meta box.

```
function wcpvd_movie_info_meta_box( $post ) {  
    //post meta box contents  
}
```


Custom Post Meta - Step 2

Custom Post Meta - Step 2

- Display our post meta box.

```
function wcpvd_movie_info_meta_box( $post ) {  
    $director = get_post_meta( $post->ID, '_wcpvd_director', true );  
    ?>  
    <p>  
        <label for="wcpvd_director"><strong>Director:</strong></label>  
        <input type="text" name="wcpvd_director" class="widefat" value="<?php echo esc_attr( $director ); ?>" />  
    </p>  
    <?php  
}
```

Custom Post Meta - Step 2

- Save our post meta.
- Use save_post action hook

```
function wcpvd_save_post( $post_id ) {  
    //Save our post meta  
}  
add_action( 'save_post', 'wcpvd_save_post' );
```

Custom Post Meta - Step 2

- Save our post meta.

```
function wcpvd_save_post( $post_id ) {  
    //Skip revisions and autosaves  
    if ( wp_is_post_revision( $post_id ) || ( defined( 'DOING_AUTOSAVE' ) && DOING_AUTOSAVE ) )  
        return;  
  
    //Users should have the ability to edit listings.  
    if ( ! current_user_can( 'edit_post', $post_id ) )  
        return;  
  
    if ( isset( $_POST['wcpvd_director'] ) ) {  
        if ( empty( $_POST['wcpvd_director'] ) ) {  
            delete_post_meta( $post_id, '_wcpvd_director' );  
        } else {  
            //Sanitize our data to prevent bad stuff  
            $director = sanitize_text_field( $_POST['wcpvd_director'] );  
            update_post_meta( $post_id, '_wcpvd_director', $director );  
        }  
    }  
}  
add_action( 'save_post', 'wcpvd_save_post' );
```

Custom Post Meta - Step 3

- Do something with the post meta.
- Prepend it to our post content.
- Append it to the title
- Give admins the choice of where it should go

```
function wcpvd_the_content( $post_content ) {  
    //Update the post content  
}  
add_filter( 'the_content', 'wcpvd_the_content', 999 );
```

Custom Post Meta - Step 3

- Do something with the post meta - post content.

```
function wcpvd_the_content( $post_content ) {  
    if ( 'wcpvd_movie' != get_post_type() )  
        return $post_content;  
  
    $director = get_post_meta( get_the_ID(), '_wcpvd_director', true );  
  
    if ( empty( $director ) )  
        return $post_content;  
  
    return '<h4 class="movie-director">' . sanitize_text_field( $director ) . '</h4>' . $post_content;  
}  
add_filter( 'the_content', 'wcpvd_the_content', 20 );
```


Custom Post Meta - Step 3

- Do something with the post meta - post title.

```
function wcpvd_the_title( $post_title, $post_id ) {  
    if ( 'wcpvd_movie' != get_post_type( $post_id ) )  
        return $post_title;  
  
    $director = get_post_meta( $post_id, 'wcpvd_director', true );  
  
    if ( empty( $director ) )  
        return $post_title;  
  
    return $post_title . ' - ' . sanitize_text_field( $director );  
}  
add_filter( 'the_title', 'wcpvd_the_title', 20, 2 );
```

Add Custom Setting

- Use the 'admin_init' action hook.

```
function wcpvd_admin_init() {  
    //Settings code  
}  
add_action( 'admin_init', 'wcpvd_admin_init' );
```

Add Custom Setting

    register_setting( 'reading', 'wcpvd_director_display' );  
  
    add_settings_field( 'wcpvd_director_display', 'Director Display', 'wcpvd_director_display_field', 'reading' );  
}  
add_action( 'admin_init', 'wcpvd_admin_init' );
```



    $option = get_option( 'wcpvd_director_display' );  
    ?>  
    <select name="wcpvd_director_display">  
        <option value="post_title" <?php selected( 'post_title', $option ); ?>>After Post Title</option>  
        <option value="post_content" <?php selected( 'post_content', $option ); ?>>Before Post Content</option>  
    </select>  
    <?php  
}
```
