
Anatomy of a Workflow





Challenges



Multiple branches still receive security updates

20 branches (3.7-5.6) at the time



PHP Version Support

Each WordPress version varies

Older branches test older versions of PHP using legacy images specific to TravisCI.



Docker environment only exists in some branches

Only 5.3-5.6 had this at the time.



Drastically different Node.JS versions

The 3.7 branch used Node.JS v0.10.48



Changing Node.JS versions =

Increased package sizes for auto-updates



Build process varies in each branch



Not just the WordPress Develop repository

20/57 GitHub repos had TravisCI builds



What's been done?

More consistent tooling across all branches

- All branches updated to use Node.JS 14 🗸
- Docker environment backported to old branches 🗸
- Versions of npm dependencies now mostly consistent across branches <a>V
- grunt-patch-wordpress available in all branches 🗸



What's been done?

Restored automated scanning and testing

- Workflow files backported to all older branches 🔽
- Slack notifications restored V
- Test results reporting to the Host Test Results page $oldsymbol{V}$



What's left?

Continued refinements to contributing

- Switch from JSHint to ESLint
- Use GitHub Badges for build status indicators
- Better contributor onboarding
- Automated contribution tracking
- Automatically close pull requests after SVN commits
